Large-Scale ABC Implementation

From October 2022 to December 2025, TCC successfully completed **30,839 dog sterilizations** under the Animal Birth Control (ABC) programme, out of an estimated stray dog population of **43,767**, achieving **approximately 70.5% sterilization coverage** and demonstrating sustained commitment to humane population management

Extensive Anti-Rabies Vaccination Drive

As part of the Anti-Rabies Vaccination (ARV) drive, **Animals Helping Hands Trust**, in coordination with the Corporation, undertook the target of vaccinating **15,000 dogs**, of which **5,000 dogs were successfully covered in Phase I**. This initiative significantly strengthened rabies prevention efforts



In addition, ARV booster doses were administered in collaboration with the Animal Husbandry Department, with support from the 1962 Animal Ambulance Service, covering multiple locations to ensure wider protection.





Capacity Building and Professional Training

TCC became one of the first corporations in Tamil Nadu to utilize its own infrastructure to conduct **hands-on ABC surgical training along with CSAVA** for 20 veterinary doctors, providing certification and strengthening technical expertise in the field





100% Coverage and Programme Expansion

After achieving **100% ABC coverage** in corporation-controlled areas, TCC expanded its activities to migration-prone regions such as **Lalgudi, Thuvakudi, and Samayapuram**, ensuring broader population control and disease prevention.

Strong Infrastructure and 24×7 Operations

With **4 ABC centres, 5 dog-catching vehicles, 5 veterinary doctors, 2 Paravet, 30 dog catchers, 2 managers, and 1 typist, 5 Drivers**, TCC operates a fully functional **24×7 rescue and ABC service**, ensuring uninterrupted and efficient service delivery.

STREET DOG POPULATION CENSUS AND REPORT RELEASE (2024 2025)

In September 2024, **Animal Helping Hands**, in collaboration with the World wide Veterinary Service, Goa team, conducted a comprehensive street dog population census for the Tiruchirappalli City Corporation. The survey was carried out systematically to assess the existing dog population and evaluate the impact of ongoing ABC programmes.

The final census report was officially released in March 2025 in the presence of Honorable Mayor and Honorable Commissioner of Tiruchirappalli and Dr. Karlette, Chief Veterinary Surgeon, **WVS Goa**. The event marked an important milestone in evidence-based planning for stray dog population management.

According to the final report, the total street dog population within TCC limits was estimated at **43,767 dogs**. The data further revealed that during the two-year period from **October 2022 to October 2024, a total of 21,770 dogs had undergone ABC surgery**. This indicates that approximately **48% sterilization** coverage had been achieved during that period, reflecting substantial progress while also highlighting the need for continued and intensified efforts to reach optimal population control levels.



ANIMAL CARE AROUND THE CLOCK

THE NIGHT CATCHING INITIATIVE, INTRODUCED AS A MILESTONE IN 2024, WAS SUCCESSFULLY CONTINUED IN 2025 AS A SUSTAINED **24x7 SERVICE**, ENSURING PROMPT RESPONSE TO CANINE-RELATED COMPLAINTS AND EMERGENCIES AT ALL HOURS. THIS ONGOING EFFORT REINFORCES TCC'S COMMITMENT TO ANIMAL WELFARE, PUBLIC SAFETY, AND THE VISION OF ACHIEVING **ZERO RABIES DEATHS** THROUGH CONTINUOUS VACCINATION, ABC PROGRAMMES, AND AWARENESS INITIATIVES.

Rabies-Free City Initiative Following the completion of 5,000 ARV booster doses, efforts will be intensified to cover 15,000 dogs, with the goal of making Tiruchirappalli a rabies-free city

Dedicated Shelter for **Complaint Dogs A separate shelter** facility will be established for complaint dogs requiring treatment, with dedicated **veterinary doctors and staff available 24x7** to ensure prompt care and management

Implementation of Dog Identification System Plans are underway to **introduce a microchipping system** for better identification, monitoring, and management of the stray dog population.

Establishment of Diagnostic Laboratory. A dedicated diagnostic laboratory will be developed to facilitate accurate diagnosis of diseases such as bacterial & other viral infections, enabling evidence- based treatment and improved clinical out comes
